




EMERGENCY DETENTION – DOCTOR’S HOLDING POWER
 (Section 5(2) Mental Health Act 1983)

The person in charge of your treatment	

Why can I not leave Eastway?

	<p>You agreed to come to Eastway because you were unwell and needed help.</p> <p>You have decided to leave Eastway.</p> <p>The doctor thinks you are still unwell and it would not be safe to let you leave Eastway.</p>

How long do I have to stay in Eastway?

	<p>You have to stay in Eastway until you are seen by the person in charge of your care.</p> <p>This will be no more than 72 hours.</p>
	<p>You must not leave until the person in charge has seen you.</p> <p>The nurses have told them to come and see you.</p> <p>If you try and leave the staff can stop you.</p>

What happens next?



The person in charge of your care will decide when they see you if you can leave Eastway.

If the doctor decides it is not safe to let you leave Eastway then they can use the law to make you stay.

2 other registered professionals must agree with them.

What treatment will I be given?



You cannot be given any treatment you do not want unless it is an emergency.

How do I complain?
